TO BE A MENTOR –or–TO BE MENTORED Optional Camerata Community-Service Mentor Program

Eighth-graders and high school students in Camerata can earn community service credit by volunteering time to the GGP and mentoring its younger students through a variety of volunteer activities including but not limited to:

- ✓ Mentoring a younger student with supervised practices
- ✓ Monitoring chamber groups at run-through prior to Chamber Music Recitals
- ✓ Coaching theory students
- ✓ Performing administration tasks necessary in support of GGP activities
- ✓ Creating and completing a customized GGP community service project of your own design

How to participate

Camerata Students

If you are interested in **being a mentor**, please email Joan Murray who will submit your name to the Mentor Program Parent Coordinator (MPP).

The MPP coordinator will assign you to a younger student or approve your customized volunteer community service project. You will be given a Frequent Volunteer Card, which you will use to track your hours of community service. You will be responsible for proactively activating your community service by contacting the parent of your mentor student or the GGP faculty member you are volunteering to assist. It will be your duty to keep track of your hours by having your student's parent or the faculty member sign your Frequent Volunteer Card each time.

At the end of April of each year, you will turn in your Frequent Volunteer Card to the MPP. You will receive a letter from Joan Murray, Executive Director, stating the number of volunteer hours you served for submission to your schools. All students with meaningful community service will be recognized at our closing ceremony.
